San Bernardino, CA, August 15, 2011 - Community Action Partnership of San Bernardino County (CAPSBC), the designated Community Action Agency for San Bernardino County, is seeking nominees to represent the low-income residents of Supervisorial District 4 on its Community Action Board (CAB). The CAB serves as the governing body of CAPSBC. The CAB is a fifteen-member, tripartite board comprised of public, private and low-income sector representatives.

The CAB meets the third Tuesday of each month at 4:30 p.m. at its Corporate Office located at 696 S. Tippecanoe Ave. in San Bernardino. There are ten meetings per year, January through November, with no meetings during the months of August and December.

Each supervisorial district is designated one director on the CAB. Board members serve a term of three years. District 4 includes: Montclair, Ontario, Chino and Chino Hills.

Nominees must be at least 18 years of age; a registered voter and must reside in District 4.
